Program: Combined Divisions, Warning Signal 0855 hours

This race is a SYC tower start, West Channel Pile finish, governed by the current SYC Sailing Instructions and the Notice of Race, except as amended below.

Please note that this is no longer a shared event with RBYC as may have been indicated in the program.

1. Sign On

A boat intending to race shall contact SYC Tower on VHF Channel 77 from 0830 to 0845 on 26th November 2011, advising her sail number, boat name and number of people on board (POB) and receive acknowledgment from the SYC Tower.

2. Finish

The finishing line will be between the West Channel Pile and an orange flag on a committee vessel flying the SYC Burgee moored to the east of the West Channel Pile. In event that the finishing vessel is not on station, competitors are requested to take their own finishing time when they are abeam of West Channel Pile and not more than 150 metres from West Channel Pile. If taking your own time, finish times shall be sent through to SYC Boating Office through the following alternatives:

3. Communication

The race radio frequency during the race will be VHF Channel 82 and backup Channel 77. Channel 77 shall use used for pre-start communications.

Please note that VHF Channel 82 is a duplex channel. Your VHF radio needs to be set to international mode for you to be able to both transmit and receive calls on duplex channels. This amends SYC SI Clause 27.

In addition to SYC Tower, a radio relay vessel will operate from the start time until the finish of the last competitor. The name of the Radio Relay vessel shall be announced prior to the start by SYC Tower on VHF Channel 77.

4. Yachts Retiring

Should a boat retire from the race, every effort must be made to advise the SYC Tower, the Radio Relay Vessel or SYC Boating Office as soon as possible and to give the following information:

- Time and position at the time of retirement.
- Reason for retirement.
- The port to which the yacht is returning.

This amends SYC SI Clause 22.

5. Marks
